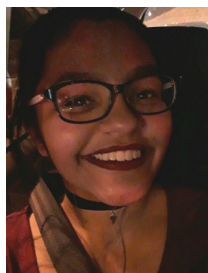


thoroughly enjoyed the event.

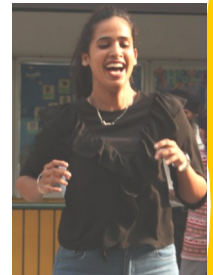
Teachers Day
